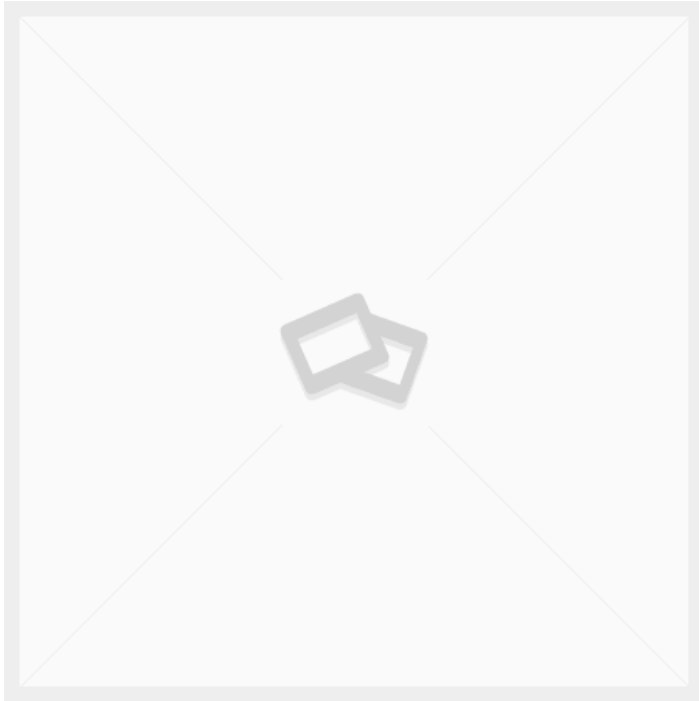

But be careful with volatility; prices can swing wildly overnight which could impact your buying power if you're not careful.
